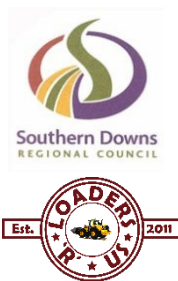

Dear Competitor,

Once again 2021 was a hell of a ride! After some sleepless nights and a mountain of work done by our volunteer committee, we were able to host our event three weeks later than originally planned, but we did it! This year, fingers crossed, we are well and truly on the path back to normal.

We are very excited to invite you to submit your registration to compete at the Historic Leyburn Sprints to be held on the 20th and 21st August 2022. This will be the 26th running of the event, and as usual, we are beavering away at things behind the scenes to continue to improve the event, and make it even more enjoyable for competitors and spectators alike, along with of course, friends, family and volunteer.

I am pleased to announce that Tourism and Events Queensland has once again supported the event. Their support, as well as that of a number of other sponsors and supporters, allows us to continue to make improvements to the event for the benefit of both competitors and spectators. Please support them wherever and whenever you can.

Again proceeds from the event will be distributed amongst a variety of worthy community group, as well as ensuring that we are in a position to be able to keep bringing you this fantastic event. This year we will be supporting the Leyburn Mens Shed, and we will also add more to our Historic Leyburn Sprints Community Fund. Money raised for this fund will go towards improvements throughout our fantastic little village.

We have now raised the entry prices for close to 10 years, however with rising costs we have made the decision to increase this by \$10 to \$250, whilst camping in the pit paddocks remains at \$40 for the weekend, and \$75 if you wish to camp across the creek. Those competitors who wish to camp in the race precinct area are reminded this area is for competitor camping only – there is plenty of space for others to camp in the area beside the creek. As space is at a premium in the paddock, an area of approx. 7 x 8 metres will be allocated to each entrant, so please be mindful of fellow competitors. **For 2022, we are taking online bookings for camping across the creek, but this is not applicable for the pits/paddock camping.**

Friends, teams and/or clubs who wish to camp together will need to organise their own sites and are urged to get in early to secure their spots. However, please note that due to the eagerness of some competitors in past years, we have in place a policy that if any sites are roped off prior to the 13th August, they will be removed. The committee and local council want to make the area as nice as possible prior to the weekend, and that includes mowing – roping off areas too early hinders this process.

Please complete the entry form at your earliest convenience and post, or scan and email it to the Event Secretary, Rod Sams. Please note that entries close at 5.00pm Friday 8th July – no late entries will be accepted, you will also need to ensure that you have paid your entry fee by the 8th July.

The Show 'n' Shine and Vintage Caravan displays will once again be a feature of the Sprints, plus there will be many stalls and food outlets on the grounds. Don't forget the Ann Collins Memorial is again available this year, for juniors entering in a 'regularity' style competition - we encourage all juniors to apply to compete.

We are looking forward to welcoming you to Leyburn in August.

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1 AUTHORITY:

The event will be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules of Motorsport Australia, the Speed Event Standing Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any further regulations or instructions which may be issued in respect to

Motorsport Australia Permit Number: **422/2108/01**

The Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Safety 1st and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au. Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the www. Insurance Handbook, available at www.motorsport.org.au.

2 EVENT DESCRIPTION:

The event will be a multi-club status, speed event and will be timed sprints conducted on selected closed public roads at Leyburn, Qld, on Saturday 20th and Sunday 21st August 2022. The course is approximately 1000 metres in length and is a bitumen sealed circuit.

3 PROMOTER:

The event will be promoted and organised by the Historic Leyburn Sprints Inc., PO Box 75 Leyburn Qld 4365

6 JUDGES OF FACT:

- Scrutineers shall be deemed Judges of Fact in respect to safety equipment, eligibility of vehicles, all documents are current and correct, and the measurement of emitted noise.
- The Start Official (his/her assistants where applicable) shall be deemed Judges of Fact in respect to starting grid procedures and false starts, and finish line procedures.
- The Chief Time Keeper (and his/her assistant if applicable) shall be deemed to be the Judges of Fact relative to the order of finish.

- d) Every official of the event shall be a Judge of Fact in respect of vehicle speed in the pit / paddock areas, short cuts and displacement of witches hats on the circuit.

7 START:

Competition will commence at approximately 8.00 a.m. and will conclude at approximately 5.00 p.m. on Saturday 20th August 2022, and will continue from approximately 8.00 a.m. until approximately 3.00 p.m. on Sunday 21st August 2022. Any changes will be notified in Further Regulations.

8 ENTRIES

Entries open with the issue of these regulations and close at 5.00pm on Friday 8th July 2022. **The entry fee for this event is \$250.00.** Each Entry will receive three (3) passes, one Event Cap, one commemorative Shirt and a Program. Additional weekend passes can be purchased, at a discount, with your entry for \$25.00 each. Weekend passes are also available at the event for \$35.00. **See the General Information Section of these Regulations for details of Pass allocation.**

A \$50.00 fee will apply to dishonoured cheques. Cheques and money orders are to be payable to “**Historic Leyburn Sprints Inc.**” (Please no cash through the mail).

Please Note: Extra caps, shirts and programs can be purchased at the event.

Camping fees (\$40.00 a site for the weekend) apply for competitors/crew camping in the paddock area and race precinct area. For those camping on the recreational reserve (across the creek) the cost will be \$75.00. Special passes will be issued for each campsite and enforced. **For Competitors who are camping in the Race Precinct area please include the fee as part of your entry payment.**

Please send a separate payment for each entry if paying by cheque. This will avoid delays in returning fees that may need to be refunded. Entry Forms must be completed in full, accompanied by the entry fee or EFT advice, **with a current photo of the vehicle by email** showing how the car will be presented for our event and lodged with the Secretary of the Event. **Entries received without payment or a suitable current photo of the vehicle may not be classed as entries received.** Scanned and emailed entries will be accepted. The original copy is to be presented at scrutineering. The event is limited to 180 starters (more may be accepted at the discretion of the organisers). (Preference will be given to historic log booked vehicles and 5th category vehicles).

The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason, in accordance with the provisions of NCR 33. In the event of an entry not being accepted all monies paid will be refunded.

- a) **CHANGE OF DRIVER:** A change of Driver may be permitted subject to **NCR 54**.
- b) **RELIEF DRIVER: ONE** Relief Driver will be allowed at this event only if nominated on the Entry Form, but competitors should be aware that the two drivers will share the same number of runs as would one driver competing in all runs.
- c) **DOUBLE ENTRIES IN ONE VEHICLE**
One entry only per vehicle will be allowed. In special circumstances some competition vehicles may be used by guests for demonstration and promotional drives with the approval of the Clerk of Course.
- d) **RETURN OF ENTRY FEES:** The withdrawal of an entry must be notified in writing to the Secretary of the Meeting:
1) An administration fee of \$50.00 may be deducted from the refund of the entry fee for withdrawals prior to 5:00pm Friday 8th of July 2022.
2) After 8th July 2022 the entry fee will be non-refundable.

9 PARENTAL CONSENT:

If any competitor (car owner), driver or pit crew is under 18 years of age, the consent of his/her parent or guardian must appear on the entry form, as must be the name, address and signed consent of his / her parent or Legal Guardian.

10 PERSONS ELIGIBLE:

The event shall be open to persons who hold a minimum of a Motorsport Australia Speed Licence or higher. Competitor must be a member of a Motorsport Australia Affiliated Club. **Motorsport Australia Licences will NOT be issued at the event.**

11 JUNIOR COMPETITION

The event will include a ‘regularity’ style event for Junior competitors. To be eligible to compete in this event competitors must:-

- a) Be over 14 years old and be under 18 years old on the 21st August 2021
- b) Be entered in a car with an engine capacity up to and including 2000cc. No turbo/superchargers allowed
- c) See the attached **Junior Competition Instructions and Information Sheet** for running details.

Juniors will be eligible for Class awards with the winner being recognised on the Ann Collins Memorial Trophy.

12 SCRUTINEERING:

- a) Scrutineering will be held in Warwick Street at the junction of Macintyre Street, Leyburn

- b) Scrutineering times may be extended and / or may be conducted at other times at the discretion of the Clerk of Course and Chief Scrutineer.
Scrutineering on Friday is optional and is intended to lessen the number of cars required for scrutineering on Saturday.
- c) Each competitor will be provided with a scrutineering check sheet for their vehicle.

- d) All vehicles must be scrutineered prior to participating; only authorised vehicles may practice and compete. The onus is on the owner of the vehicle to present an eligible vehicle at scrutineering and at any time during competition.
- e) **Documents:** The following documents must be presented to the document checker prior to cars being scrutineered:
 - 1) Current Motorsport Australia **Competition Licence** (Speed or higher)
 - 2) Current Motorsport Australia affiliated Car Club **Membership Card**.
 - 3) Motorsport Australia **Vehicle Log Book** for the subject vehicle (if applicable),
 - 4) **CTPI Extension (for Queensland road registered automobiles)**. Automobiles registered in Queensland under the "Transport Operations (Road Use Management – Vehicle Registrations) Regulation 2010" require a **Compulsory Third Party Insurance (CTPI) extension valid for this meeting. These are not available at the event.**
- f) **Timing:** Competitors should note that the event will be timed using an **Electronic Beam system for timing (No Transponders required)**.
- g) **Apparel:** All driving apparel including helmets and frontal head restraints, clothing and footwear must be presented to the scrutineers at the time of scrutiny of the subject car. Apparel must be in accordance with Schedule D of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.
- h) **EVENT SPONSOR DECALS MUST BE DISPLAYED ON VEHICLES AT ALL TIMES**, if supplied by the organisers, where permitted by the NCR's.

13 DRIVERS' BRIEFING:

The **compulsory** attendance of all drivers is required at the driver's briefing to be held at a time and place to be announced in Further Supplementary Regulations.

14 INSURANCE:

- a) The Promoters have arranged public liability insurance with Motorsport Australia.
- b) Third Party Insurance: All competing vehicles carrying civil registration in Queensland require a Third Party extension certificate or letter (CTP) stating the full title of the event, location and date.
- c) Non-registered Vehicles: Any vehicle not registered will be covered by special permit issued to the Promoter by Queensland Transport.

15 PROTESTS:

Protests must be lodged in accordance with NCRs 94 – 99 as per the current Motorsport Australia Manual.

16 ABANDONMENT:

Event organisers have the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the event in accordance with NCR 11 of the current Motorsport Australia Manual..

17 ALCOHOL / DRUGS:

Any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Anti-Doping Policy and/or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the Motorsport Australia website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.

18 VEHICLE CATEGORIES

Entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Organisers, and will be restricted to the following:

- a) 5th Category Historic Cars,
- b) Groups A, C, F, J, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, S, T & V,
- c) Marque Sports Cars (Group 2A & 2B),
- d) Sports 1300 (Group 2C),
- e) Sports Cars. Participation by sports cars is subject to Track Licence conditions of issue & Motorsport Australia approval.
- f) Invited Cars. Participation by invited cars is subject to Track Licence conditions of issue & Motorsport Australia approval

Note: The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate classes if a small number of entries are received for a particular class including amalgamation of capacity or year of manufacture as determined by the organisers.

If a vehicle model is predominantly in a year group/class a newer or later year model near identical vehicle may be merged into that group/class regardless of year at the discretion of the organisers.

No protest or discussion regarding class, groups, year of manufacture or capacity will be entered into.

19 DETERMINATION OF WINNERS

The results will be determined by fastest to the slowest in each class.

20 AWARDS

1st, 2nd and 3rd in each class. The fastest Historic car and the fastest overall car. Other awards may be awarded at the discretion of the organising committee.

21 APPAREL:

Drivers must wear apparel in accordance with Schedule D of the current Motorsport Australia Manual:

- a) A helmet that complies with AS1698 and carries marking to that effect; or be otherwise specifically approved by also appropriately marked to that effect.
- b) As of 1 January 2020 it is mandatory for drivers to wear a Frontal Head Restraint (FHR) in Speed events in certain vehicle categories.
 - 1) 1st Category Vehicles
 - 2) Vehicles with a Motorsport Australia Log Book. See requirements of Schedule D Article 1.4.

FHR.

- Please refer to the attached Frontal Head Restraints in Speed Events Flowchart to determine if you are required to wear a
- c) Non-flammable clothing must be from ankles to neck to wrist. No person will be permitted to compete wearing apparel of nylon or similar material
 - d) Suitable non-flammable footwear. Feet must be completely covered with leather boots or shoes or other flame-resistant material (thongs, roman sandals and high-heeled shoes are prohibited).
 - e) Goggles or visors with lens other than glass (AS1609-1981) in open cars. See Schedule D Article 3.4.

22 SAFETY – CARS:

The attention of competitors is drawn to Schedules A and B of the General Requirements of Automobiles found in Section Six of the current Motorsport Australia Manual. The following should be specially noted:-

- a) All cars must be fitted with
 - 1) Seat Belts of a type specifically listed in Schedule I of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.
 - 2) A fire extinguisher (securely fitted), which complies with AS1841 Except AS1841.2 (See Schedule H of the Motorsport Australia Manual)
 - 3) All headlights, glass lens and all forward facing glass lenses, must be adequately taped.
 - 4) Competition numbers – (Supplied by the promoter).
- b) **GENERAL:**
 - 1) If using tubeless tyres they must be fitted only to the optimum rim size.
 - 2) Fuel must be 'Commercial Fuel' as defined by Motorsport Australia (Schedule G of the current Motorsport Australia Manual).
 - 3) Only roll bars, which comply with Motorsport Australia requirements, are permitted.
 - 4) Noise emissions must not exceed 95 dBA measured 30m from the track edge at any time.
 - 5) Slick tyres are allowed for those Groups and classes where provided for in the Motorsport Australia Manual.

23 PRECINCT SPEED LIMIT:

The speed limit in the Pit / Paddock area and all other areas within the Leyburn Precinct proper, excluding the competition circuit, is ten kilometres per hour (10 kph) walking pace. Every official of the event shall be a Judge of Fact in respect of vehicle speed in the pit / paddock areas. Any breach of this speed limit by ANY competition vehicle or competitor service vehicle may incur the exclusion of the competitor from their next competition run notwithstanding that the Stewards of the Meeting may impose a greater penalty.

24 COMPLIANCE WITH INSTRUCTION:

Failure to follow the lawful direction of any Official of the Meeting will be deemed to be a breach of the rules and may result in exclusion from the event or a greater penalty.

25 VEHICLE DEMONSTRATIONS

Various vehicles may complete laps of the track at non-competitive speed for demonstration purposes in accordance with NCR 20b, not as part of the competition. This will be at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course/Race Director.

26 STATIC DISPLAY

A variety of vehicles will be on display throughout the weekend to form a static display.

27 LEAVING THE EVENT PRECINCT

Unregistered vehicles must not be driven outside the event precinct area. Competitors must not leave the event precinct to warm tyres and test components. Any competitor found in breach of these conditions may forfeit all further runs for that day or both days for all drivers of that vehicle. Once outside the race precinct all drivers are subject to normal road rules and regulations.

28 COVID – 19 STATEMENT

The event will be conducted in accordance with the Queensland Health covid management requirements in place at the time of the event. Competitors and crews are reminded for their own well-being to continue following social distancing and good hygiene practices while at the event.

End of Supplementary Regulations

GENERAL INFORMATION (Not forming part of these Supplementary Regulations)

ORGANISERS NOTE:

The event organisers have a good relationship with both the Queensland Police Service and the local community and it is that relationship that allows the event to be conducted each year. The Queensland Police Service will monitor the movement of competitor's vehicles and will take action accordingly as required.

EVENT PASSES:

All members of your crew/team will need to purchase an entry pass to attend the event. Children under 14 are free. This year each entry will receive three (3) passes as part of the entry payment. Extra Weekend passes can be purchased with your entry for the discounted price of \$25.00. No discounted tickets available at the Event.

Please fill out your pass allocation on the payment section of the Entry Form. Ensure you have read the instructions and complete as appropriate.

ACCOMMODATION:

Camping:

Basic campsites are available in a designated area across from the General Store for tents, caravans, campervans etc. at \$75 per tent/caravan/campervan etc., where hot showers and toilet facilities are provided Thursday to Sunday (that's \$75 for the total period, not per night). Bookings are being taken for these campsites – please refer to Facebook and our website for further details.

For competitors/crew camping in the paddock area, streets or other areas of the race precinct the fee will be \$40.00. Special passes will be issued for each campsite and enforced. For Competitors who are camping within the race precinct area please include the fee as part of your entry payment. These fees assist the organising committee to provide adequate toilets, showers and other facilities for campers.

To ensure adequate sites for camping in the paddock area each competitor will be allocated an approximate area of seven by eight metres for their race vehicle and camp site. Only one service/tow vehicle allowed per race vehicle. All others must be parked in the general parking area outside of the precinct. Trailers MUST be placed in the trailer parking area. We rely on you to only take the space you need, if it is deemed that you are taking up more space than necessary, you will be asked to downsize.

Please Note: No sites in the Race Precinct area are to be roped off prior to the 14th August.

Extra accommodation may be available at a number of locations on the Downs:

Warwick – 60 kms from Leyburn by road offers many choices for accommodation including motels, hotels B&Bs and caravan parks.

Toowoomba - 70 kms by road from Leyburn also offers many choices for accommodation.

Other smaller centres such as Pittsworth - 44 kms, Clifton -38 kms and Allora - 45 kms also may have accommodation available.

OTHER:

PLEASE DO NOT BRING DOGS TO THE EVENT: Dogs, except for assistance dogs, are strictly prohibited within the race precinct area. If you wish to camp in the pits/paddock area you are not allowed to have a dog with you.

Junior Competition Instructions and Information 20th / 21st August 2022



As per previous years, those who are eligible to compete for the Ann Collins Junior Memorial Trophy will run in a regularity style event for the Junior Award and will also be eligible for awards in their normal (car) category.

This event will run in compliance with the Speed Event Standing Regulations and Regularity Trial Standing Regulations. Apparel requirements are as per Schedule D for Speed Events.

Important Instructions and information for the weekend:

1. All juniors will each be given a run either right at the start of the racing on the Saturday morning, or very close to. This will be a 'free' run, where it is timed, but will not count towards any results, and it will be in addition to the number of runs that you get over the weekend (which is usually about 7). The purpose of this run will be to establish a time, and you'll then use this time to set your regularity time.
2. Based on your time that you did on this run, you'll nominate your time and submit this to Junior Competition Co-ordinator who will be managing the points over the weekend. It is recommended that you set a time that is slightly faster, as more often than not your times will get faster over the weekend.
3. You'll have time to talk to your parents/friends about what time you want to nominate. The Co-ordinators location will be advised in Further Regulations, so you'll have to visit there when you are ready to nominate. If, during the course of the weekend, you wish to modify your time, you can. However obviously the points from the runs that have already been completed cannot be changed.
4. After you do your initial 'time setting' run, you'll run in your normal respective classes, but you will also have a 'J' sticker on your car, so that the spectators know when a junior is out on track – everyone is extremely interested in the juniors and want to see them go well!
5. At the end of each of your runs, your points will be updated and displayed on Facebook, and also on a special board that will be displayed at the front of the pub for the duration of the weekend.
6. The points system will work as follows:
 - a. All competitors will start with zero points.
 - b. For each FULL 1/10th of a second you are quicker than your nominated time, 2 points will be deducted.
 - c. For each FULL 1/10th of a second you are slower than your nominated time, 1 point will be deducted.
 - d. Part 10th aren't counted (e.g. if you set a time of 57.00sec, and you do a 56.92, you do not lose any points, as it isn't a full 10th).
 - e. The junior with the least amount of points deducted at the end of the weekend is the winner.
 - f. Juniors must participate in at least four runs, the best four runs (that is, with the least points lost) will be combined to declare the winner.
7. Our Clerk of Course, Craig Bourke, will hold a special drivers briefing for the junior's, immediately following the normal driver's briefing (the juniors and their parents will need to attend both).

What our award encourages is not necessarily the fastest car out there, but a smooth and consistent approach to racing, which as we know is one of the keys to winning a motor racing event! We want to encourage participation and the learning of driving skills of our juniors, rather than just who can handle the fastest car. This is certainly what Ann promoted as well.

As mentioned, all juniors will still be eligible for winning places in their respective classes. One issue that might be encountered is that a junior will find themselves getting faster over the weekend and if they keep doing that, they start to blow their chances of winning the junior award, but in trade off, they are vying for a position within their class. This will need to be a decision that is made as a family, whether to slow down to keep in with a chance of the junior award, or just go for it for the class position! Not too bad a situation to be in really (but don't forget you can adjust times).
